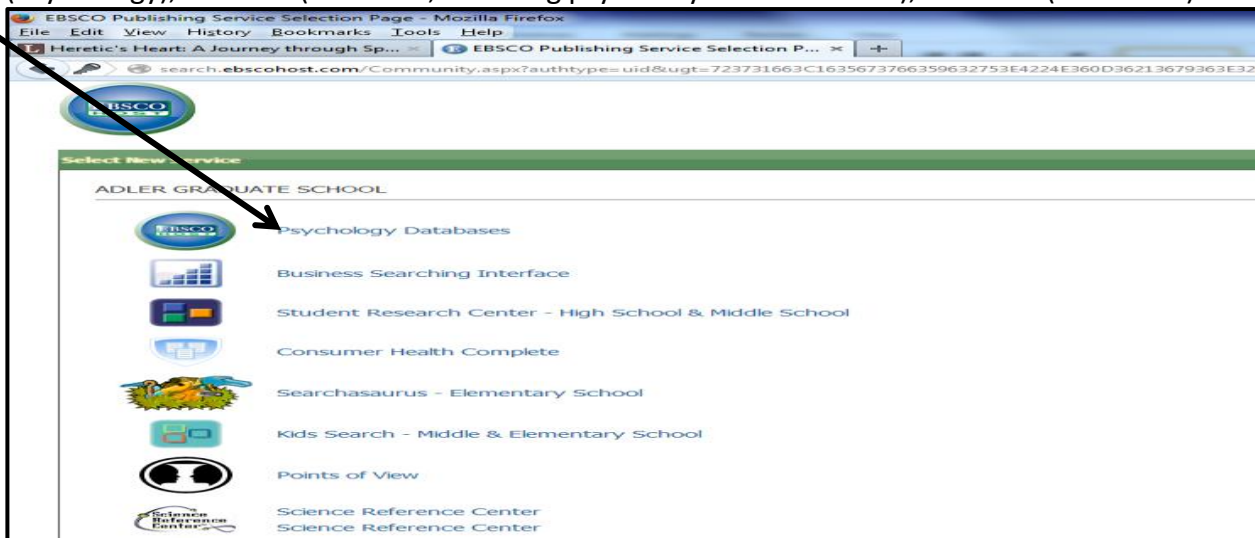

EBSCO is the main source to use when looking for articles, including databases like PsycInfo (Psychology), Medline (medicine, including psychiatry and addictions), and ERIC (education):



Once you've logged in, get started searching by selecting **Psychology Databases**. On the next page, click in the **Select/deselect all** box and then click on the yellow **Continue** button. This should take you to a page with many options for searching (e.g., by keyword, subject, title, or author).

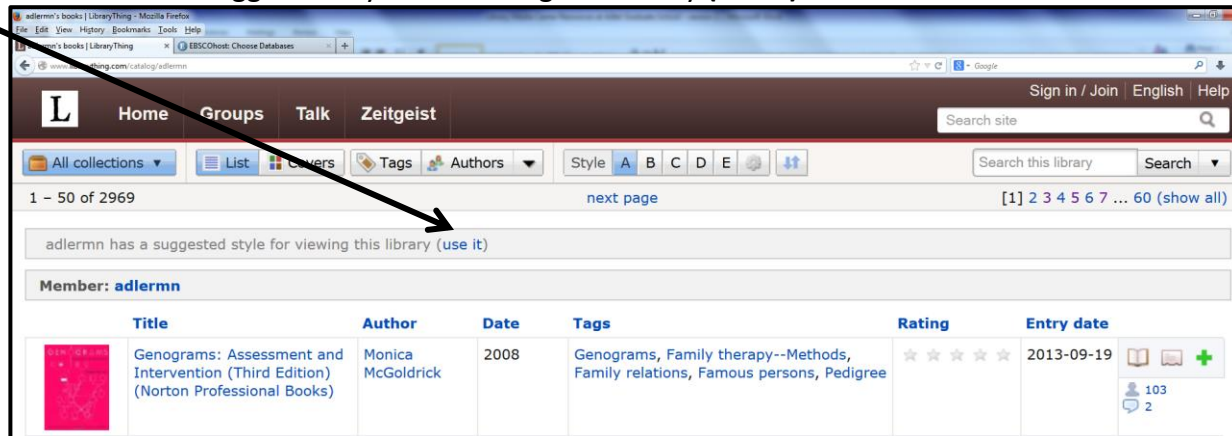

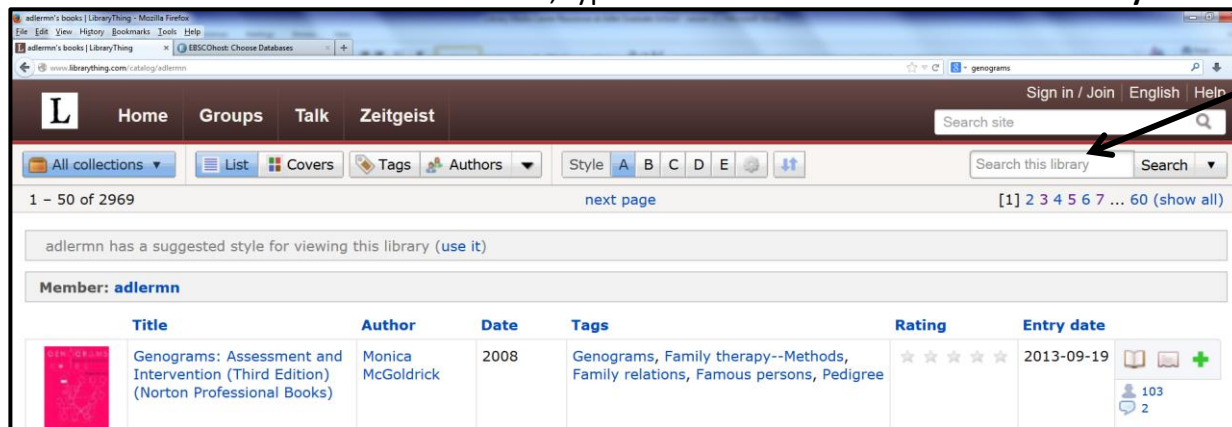

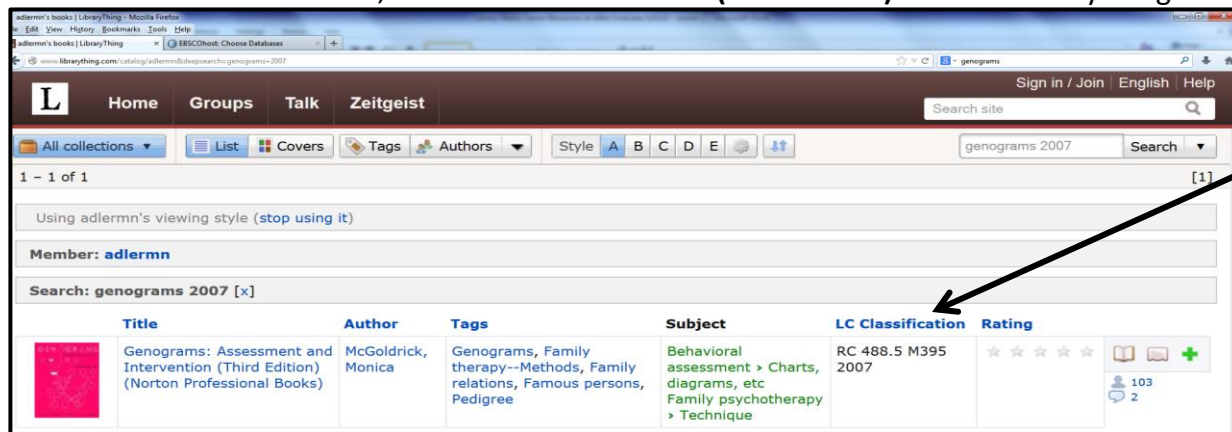
Adlermn has a suggested style for viewing this library (use it):



To search for a book in the AGS collection, type a few words into the **Search this library** box:



To find books on the shelves, use the **LC Classification (call number)** listed in LibraryThing.



For example, if I am looking for *Genograms: Assessment and Intervention* (Third Edition), I would make note of the LC Classification (call number): **RC 488.5 M395 2007**, and then go to the shelves in the library and look for that combination of letters and numbers.
